

### Session 1 – “Linux on iSeries”

SPEAKER: **Dave Boutcher, IBM Rochester**

Dave Boutcher is a Senior Technical Staff Member with the IBM iSeries development organization in Rochester, MN. He has worked with Linux on iSeries since it's earliest days, and is listed in the open source community as maintaining several of the iSeries-related Linux components. He has previously worked on OS/400 strategy and the NetServer and FSIOP development teams.

**ABSTRACT:** Linux is the latest cool technology to be added to the iSeries system and Linux is getting a huge amount of attention in the industry right now. This presentation will cover how Linux is implemented on the iSeries system, and what you can do with it if you choose to install it. The presentation will cover the latest updates to the Linux and iSeries story, including new Linux distributions, the Linux ODBC driver, and NetServer support for Linux.

**ABSTRACT:** SQL is IBM's relational database language that can be used to query, update and delete data from the database.
